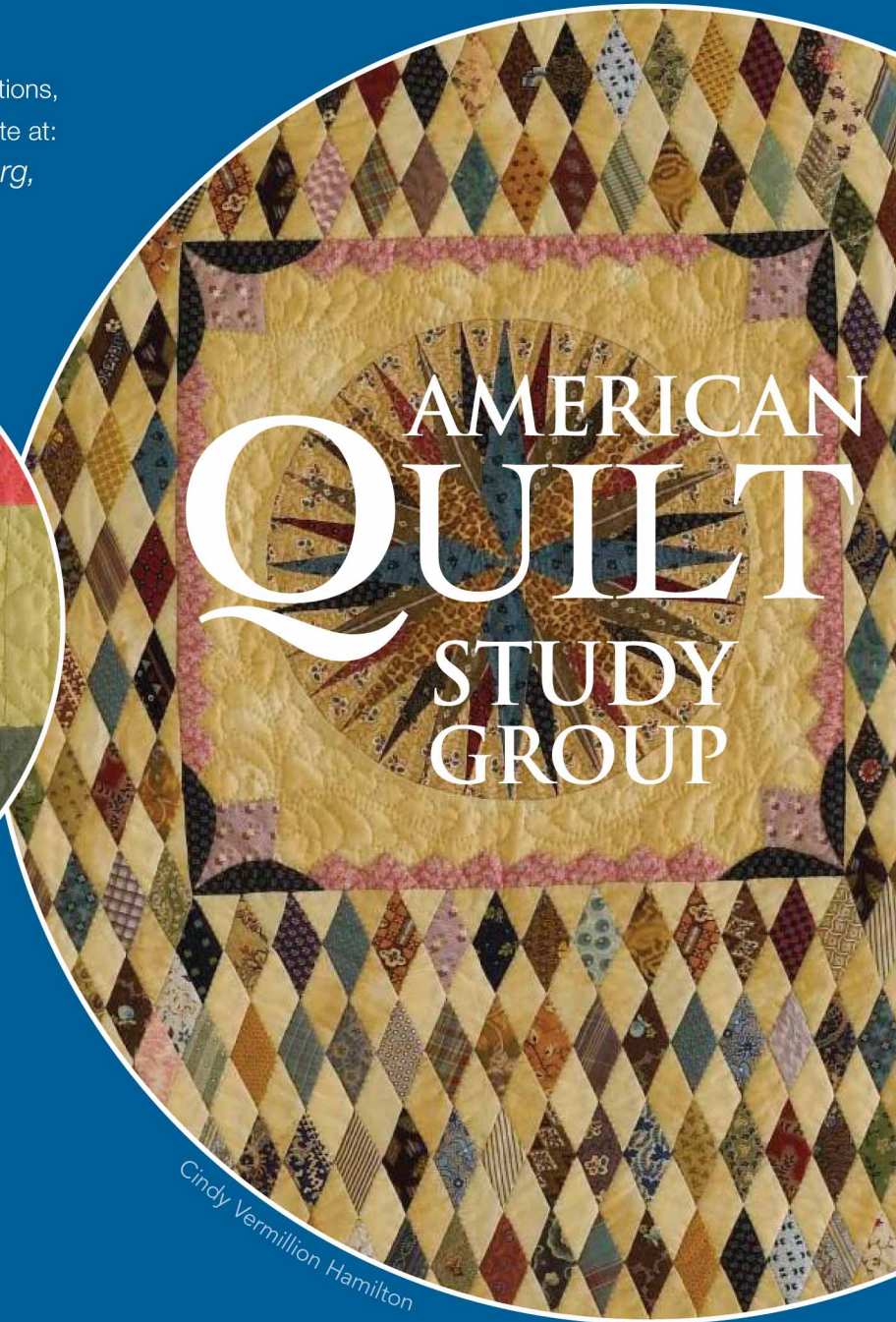

MEMBERSHIP BENEFITS

Annual Seminar: Seminar is the feature event of AQSG, held in a different city each October. It brings together all segments

of the quilt community for three to four days of intense engagement with quilt history, social context, and design. The seminar registration fee includes the presentation of research papers chosen for publication in *Uncoverings*, roundtable discussions, show & tell, informal networking, book & quilt sales, and auctions. Optional study centers and quilt-focused tours in the local area add to the experience.

Directory: The annual directory containing contact information and quilt related interests of each member is a valuable aid to research and networking. The directory is available in paper copy by mail or in PDF format sent by e-mail. Please mark your preference on the application.

Annual Journal: *Uncoverings* is the premier publication on quilt-related studies. It includes the papers presented at AQSG seminars. Every member receives each new volume of *Uncoverings*. Membership at the Associate level or higher includes two copies.

Newsletter: *Blanket Statements* is a quarterly publication of research articles, news of exhibits and other quilt events, reports from regional quilt study groups, research queries, and other information of interest. The official color version of *Blanket Statements* is sent to members by e-mail. Please mark the box on the application if you prefer a black and white paper copy by mail instead.

Discussion List: The on-line discussion list provides a forum for dialogue on research and quilt related topics, and includes a link to posting images related to the discussions.
